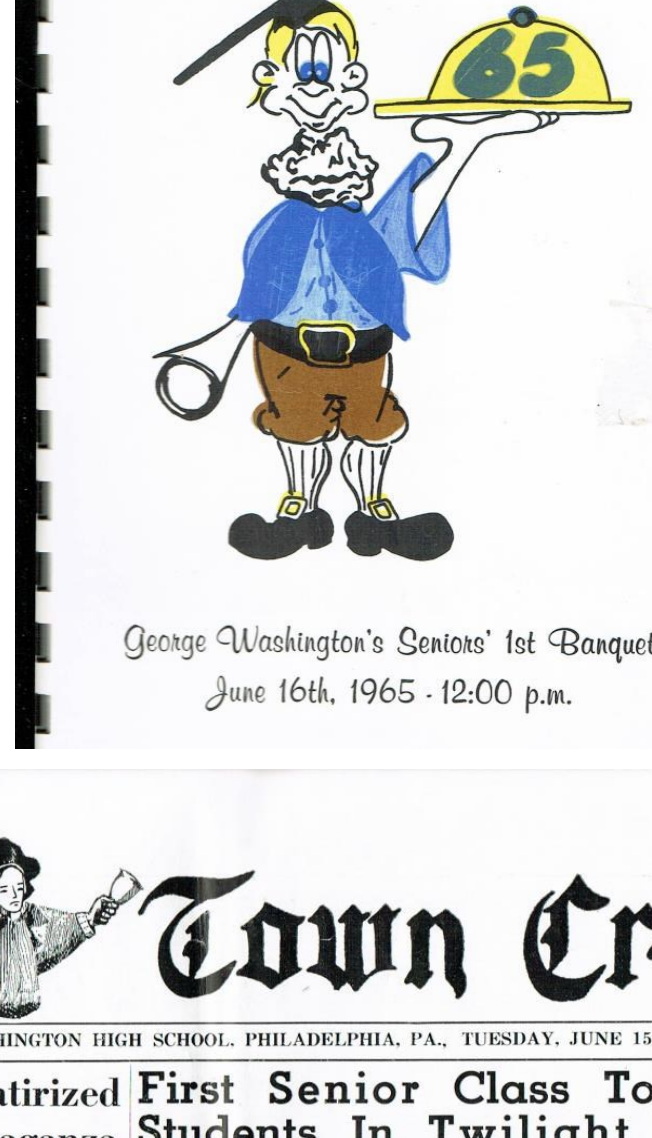

**Senior Trip**

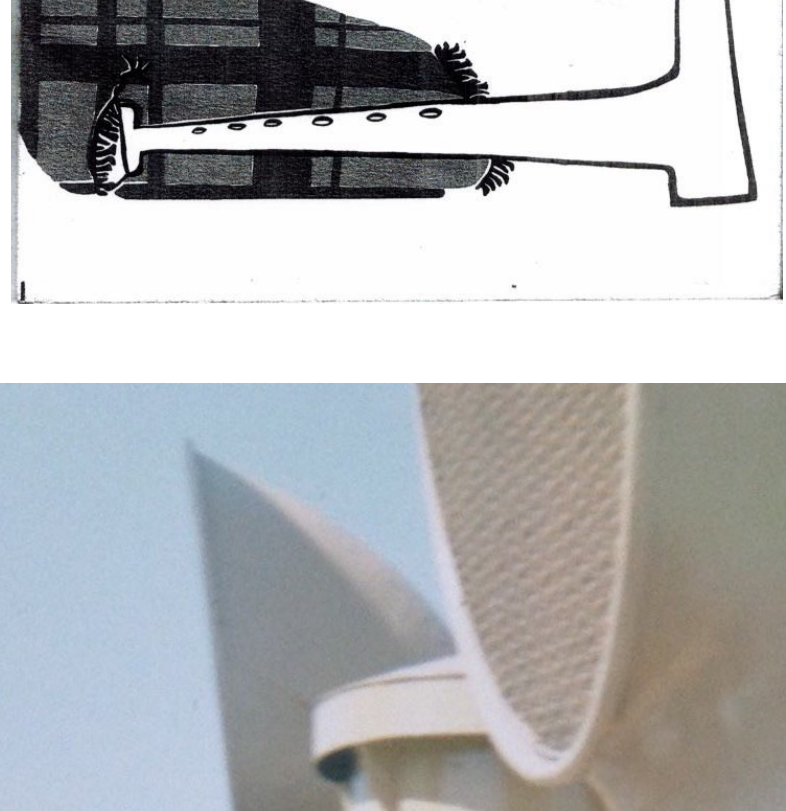
Eight hundred seniors filled twenty-three buses on Friday morning, May 21, at 7:00 a.m. for the class trip to Bear Mountain, New York. Arriving in New York City at 9:30 a.m., they embarked on a three-hour trip by boat

The graduation exercises will be held on Thursday evening, June 17, at 6:30 p.m. in Washington's stadium. The 900 graduating seniors, the orchestra, the choir, the entire administration, and guest speakers will participate in the program. As each graduate will receive four or five tickets, an estimated 1000 spectators will observe the commencement ceremonies.

The program will open with an overture, "Cappuccino Italiani" played by the Washington orchestra, conducted by Mr. Leroy Evans. The orchestra will also play in the graduation exercises and take their seats in the procession March. After the National Anthem and the invocation by Reverend George Ceele of the National Methodist Church, greetings will be given by Doris Rank, president of the Students' Association. Additional greetings will be given by Miss Beatrice & Good, Superintendent of the "Last Weeks of School" by the Washington chair under Mr. Robert Johnson's direction.

- Marge Lance (Geiger):** After graduation I attended Peirce College. I worked for Farm Journal in the marketing research Dept for 10 years and worked in my family machinery business, Lance Inc. Founded Go With Us Inc. 26 years ago. Plan museum tours, theatre events in NYC and US. Open trips and other activities of interest in the Tri State area.
